CARSON JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL BUS RULES 2008-2009

Students being transported are under the authority of the bus driver and shall observe established and appropriate standards of classroom behavior and dress while riding the bus. Students shall also observe the following specific standards:

1. Obey the driver's instructions.
2. Student must always be wearing school I D.
3. Keep aisles clear.
4. Remain seated until your scheduled stop.
5. Keep hands, arms, feet, legs and head inside the bus.
6. Talk quietly. Do not yell or use vulgar or abusive language.
7. Keep hands off others, be courteous.
8. Do not throw anything inside the bus or from the bus.
9. Do not eat or drink unless allowed to do so by the bus driver.
10. Do not carry animals, weapons, tobacco, alcohol or drugs on the bus.
11. Do not play CD players, or MP3 (I-Pod) Players.
12. Sit in assigned seats if seats are assigned.
13. Maintain appropriate standards of conduct while traveling to and from school and at the bus stop.
14. Board the bus assigned to you. You may not ride another bus without a bus pass. If you plan on riding home with another student, you must have a note from a parent/guardian before a pass can be issued from the office.
15. You may not ride the late bus home unless you were on campus for detention, a school-related activity, club activity or were staying after for extra help from a teacher / tutor. You will need to show the late bus driver proof such as a stamp card (7th hour stamped) or a late bus pass from a teacher.

DENIAL OF SCHOOL BUS SERVICE

Bus riding is a privilege—not a right. Inappropriate conduct at bus stops, on buses or in the process of boarding or disembarking a bus may result in the denial of bus-riding privileges. When school bus rules are consistently violated and cause danger to the students or drivers, the following will occur:

1. **WARNING-** The bus driver may issue a warning note to give students a chance to correct their behavior disciplinary action is taken.

2. **FIRST INFRACTION-** Following the first infraction that is documented in writing and referred to school administration, the student may be denied bus riding privileges from all buses for a minimum of one day.
3. **SECOND INFRACTION-** The second infraction that is documented in writing may result in a minimum of three days denial of bus riding privileges from all buses
4. **THIRD INFRACTION-** A third infraction that is documented in writing may result in a minimum of five days of denial of bus-riding privileges from all buses.
5. **FOURTH INFRACTION-** The fourth infraction that is documented in writing may result in denial of bus-riding privileges from all buses for one month or the remainder of the semester, whichever is longer.
6. If an infraction is deemed **SERIOUS** enough by the school administrator, the student may be denied bus-riding privileges from all buses for an entire school year.
