Dear Mountain View Families,

As we prepare to transition to In-Person Modified instruction, we wanted to thank our community for your patience, collaboration, and extensive communication. When school closure began in March, we never imagined it would be another six months before we saw our students and staff face to face. We are looking forward to reopening our campus on Monday, September 14th, as long as the data continues to trend in a favorable direction.

In preparations for In-Person Modified learning, we are providing information that is most pertinent to you, including answers to many of the questions we have received from the community. The learning preference you select (remote or in-person modified) will remain your placement through first semester. Please familiarize yourself with the information below to ensure your child(ren) has a smooth transition into this next phase of learning.

Bell Schedule Beginning September 14th - Please access the MVHS website for the new [In-Person Modified bell schedule](#). The alpha split for both in-person modified and remote learners is: A-K and L-Z. A detailed plan of each alpha section and their learning schedule is included in the new schedule. Please note that ALL learners, both remote and in-person, will follow this bell schedule according to their alpha split.

Lunches - We now have two lunch periods to support social distancing. Students must attend **ONLY** their assigned lunch period. Like all MPS schools, Mountain View will remain a closed campus. Only Seniors in good standing are allowed to leave campus during their assigned lunch period. Mountain View will be open for meal pick up for full-time remote students (and any child under 18) each Monday and Wednesday between 7am and 8am. Navigating Campus – Please use our [campus map](#) to help your student(s) locate their classrooms. Link Crew leaders will also be dispersed around campus to help students find their way to classrooms.

Will my child retain the same teachers after September 14th? The majority of our students will retain the same schedule with the same teachers. There may be a few exceptions to this, but it will impact very few students.

What is the plan for students who will continue as remote learners?

Students should continue to follow their current class schedule and must follow the new [In-Person Modified bell schedule](#). Learning will continue to be a blend of synchronous and asynchronous instruction. Teachers will communicate their requirements and expectations for learning for their individual classes beginning on September 14th.

What is the plan for students who are transitioning to in-person modified learning?

Students transitioning to modified in person learning are assigned to specific days for in-person instruction based on their last name. Students with last names A-K will attend in-person instruction Monday and Thursday and students with last names L-Z will attend in-person instruction on Tuesday and Friday. **Students can ONLY attend on their assigned days.** Students will report directly to their classrooms and must adhere to **ALL** safety guidelines including [masks](#), [sanitation stations](#) and [physical distancing](#). All employees and students are required to wear face masks while riding the bus, when on school campus, or attending school events. Confirmed cases of COVID will be reported to our on-site COVID Specialist.

What are the safety measures being used while students/staff are on campus? The MPS [Safe.Strong.Ready Mitigation Plan](#) provides guidelines for all safety measures being utilized throughout the district for both staff and students. Class sizes will be smaller due to the alpha split which will allow for spaced seating in the classrooms and fewer people in the hallways and at lunch. Class work spaces (ex: desks, chairs, tables) will be sanitized between each class period, campus-wide sanitation practices will be completed at the end of each school day by the cleaning staff, [face masks are required for all staff and students](#), and parents are responsible for monitoring student health each morning to ensure students are not coming to campus when showing any [COVID or COVID-like symptoms](#). For MPS Staff, a mandatory Daily Health Attestation is required before coming to campus, staff showing COVID or COVID-like symptoms are required to stay home, and confirmed cases of COVID will be reported to our on-site COVID Specialist.

More Details About Masks Requirement. Masks must fully cover the nose and mouth and remain in place without the use of one's hands. Masks must not have holes or vents. All employees and students are required to wear face masks while riding the bus, when on school campus, or attending school events. Visitors to Campus -To maintain safety guidelines and limit the overall number of people on campus, we ask parents to make appointments prior to visiting campus. This will ensure the appropriate staff are available to meet your needs as quickly and safely as possible.
