## Creating a Legacy of Excellence 2014-2015

The Class of 2015 earned 140 scholastic diplomas, two graduates were National Hispanic Scholars, 3 were selected as Wood's Scholars, and 25 earned status as Legacy of Excellence Honor Students. 170 members of the class combined to receive just over 900 scholarships and grants totaling more than 15.4 million dollars. Our graduates planned to study in 18 different states, ranging from Hawaii to Massachusetts, and 21 members of the class enlisted to represent Skyline around the world as they serve our country in the military.

In 2014-15:

- A school record enrollment of 638 were in Advanced Placement courses in 16 different subjects.
- 18 band, choir, and orchestra students successfully auditioned for the West Region Honor Music Festival.
- 2 ROTC students attended the National Youth Leadership Foundation Conference in Washington, DC.
- Skyline DECA students won state championships, achieved national prominence, and finished fourth in international competition in the fields of marketing and apparel and accessories.
- 18 students earned American Welding Society Certificates.
- 163 members of the Class of 2015 participated in our service learning program with 66 earning special honors on their diplomas for completing at least 150 hours of service; the total service contribution of these graduating seniors over their careers at Skyline was 25,765 documented hours, an increase of almost 9000 hours.
- In athletics, 52 individuals competed in state competitions, with 19 finishing among the top eight in their respective sports highlighted by two earning state championships in weightlifting. 17 individual school athletic records were set. Team-wise, five qualified and competed in their state tournaments, and seven had their best win-loss records in school history.
- The Tumbleweed Center for Youth Development recognized the Skyline Dance Club for their donation of \$2,574.
